### Singing in the bath

#### You will need:

- You and your baby.

Spend time singing and chanting while your baby is having their bath. Sing favourite songs and rhymes or be creative and make up your own! Remember you are your baby's favourite toy – they will love to watch you sing and it will not be long before they are babbling and cooing along with you.

#### Some songs we love to sing during bath time are:

- 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 Once I Caught a Fish Alive
- Row, Row, Row Your Boat
- 5 Little Ducks and
- Warna Munda (see song words on the next page).

#### More ideas

Keep this story handy for tummy time or play time. The black and white illustrations are perfect images for your baby to look at and to explore.

Chat with your baby as much as possible. Talking about the world around them, what you are doing together and sharing stories are all activities where your baby will hear lots of new and exciting words. Babies need to hear plenty of language before they are ready to speak themselves.

*Open, Shut Them* and *Incy Wincy Spider*.

#### Key message

Children learn language by listening to it and using it.
