

## What does your face look like?

Make a colourful puppet out of a paper bag.



## Adult supervision is essential when making and playing with home made toys.

Involve and talk with your child as much as possible while creating this activity.

## PAPER BAG FACES

### You will need:

- a copy of template
- coloured pencils, crayons or textas
- paper lunch bags
- scissors
- glue

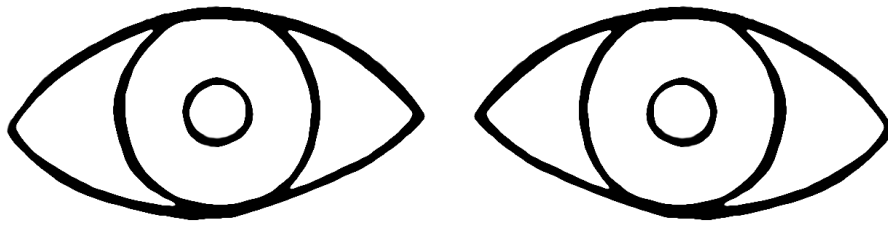
### Instructions

1. Ask your child whose face they'd like to make. It could be their own face or it could be a parent or grandparent.
2. Cut out the different facial features.
3. Making sure the bag opening is at the bottom, glue the features onto the paper bag.
4. Colour in the face. Draw on extra things like eyebrows, earrings, hair, etc.
5. Use the paper bag as a puppet.

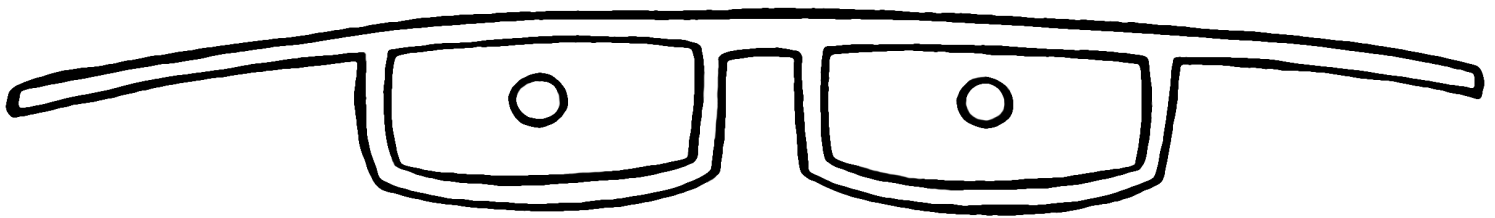
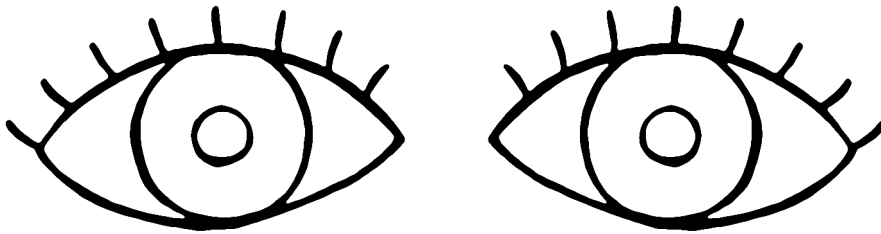
### Ideas

An alternative to drawing on hair, eyebrows, etc., is to make these features out of different materials like wool, cotton wool, pipecleaners, etc.

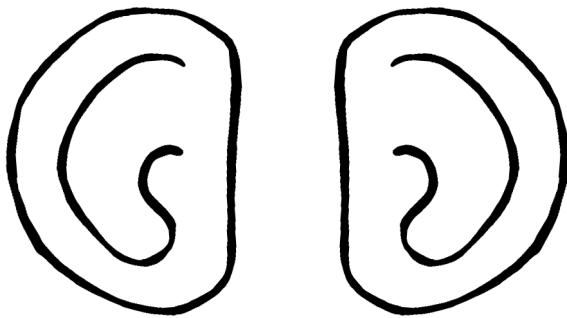
Use the puppets to talk to each other. Have fun using the puppets to pretend to be other people, for example, you be the child and the child be the adult.



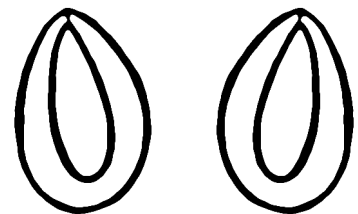
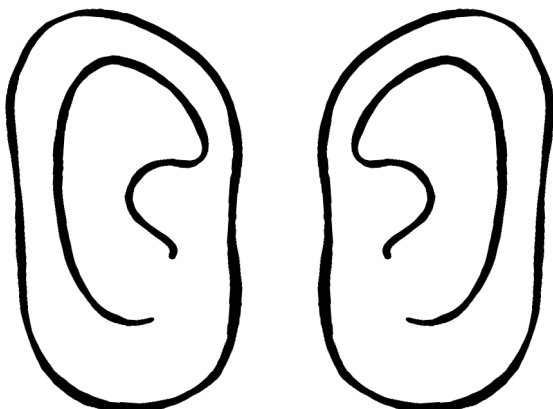
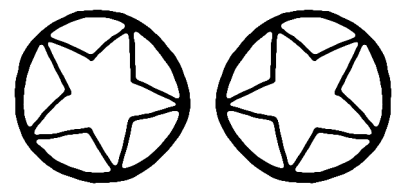
