Book title: HOW BIG IS TOO SMALL?

### Big faces

#### You will need:

- Large sheets of paper
- Scissors
- Textas, coloured pencils, crayons, etc.

#### Instructions:

1. Help your child to draw a large circle on your sheet of paper.
2. Discuss with your child what features they are drawing on the face such as: eyes, nose, mouth, hair, ears, etc.
3. Colour in and decorate
4. Cut out using scissors.

#### Further information

While looking in a mirror talk about the parts of a face and head. Does your child know all the names for each part including nostrils, eyebrows, eyelashes, freckles, cheeks, teeth, lips, forehead, etc.

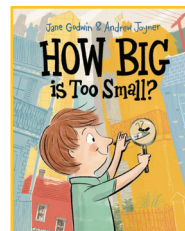
Talk with your child about how distance can affect the size of objects. Use a toy to experiment and try putting it near and far to see what happens. Can your child explain to you what they are seeing? Maybe they would like to draw a picture of their observations. Or help them write down what they see.
