

WINDOWS
Who's outside?

Make a paper window to look at things you might see outside.


Adult supervision is essential when making and playing with home made toys.

Involve and talk with your child as much as possible while creating this activity.

You will need:

- copy of activity template
- 1 piece of A4 coloured paper (optional)
- crayons, textas, pencils for decorating
- scissors
- glue

Instructions

1. Print the window template onto a piece of coloured A4 paper. (optional)
2. Cut out around the window frame and cut a hole for the window.
3. Fold along dotted line to form a pocket. Place glue along the inside edges to hold the pocket together.
4. Colour in the 4 picture cards and cut out.
5. Place the picture cards in the pocket. Look at each one in turn through the 'window frame' and talk about what you can see with your child.

Ideas

Use photos of family members to place in the window.

Try making the pocket out of cardboard.

You could decorate the window frame with drawings, stickers, etc.
